
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

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

ATRIPLE GHAMPIONSHIP DAY


HE most exciting feature of this year's Boxing Day meeting is the fact that three championships, qualifying rounds for which have been held at Brands Hatch throughout the season, remain to be settled today. They are the John Davy Formula Junior, Peco Grand Touring Car and Molyslip Saloon Car Championships.

In the John Davy Formula Junior Championship, John Fenning looks likely to maintain his present lead at the wheel of one of Ron Harris's Lola-Fords. Leading the Peco Trophy for Grand Touring cars is Roy Salvadori, while Innes Ireland and Graham Hill also have a chance of winning. But these three drivers will not be at Brands, as of course they are in South Africa, busily preparing for the vital final 1962 grand prix. Hottest favourite to take this title must therefore be Ken Baker, with his E-type Jaguar, though Bill Shaw and Roger Nathan, with their Lotus Elites, could still pull it off.

At the moment, Jonathan Williams narrowly leads the scorings in the Molyslip Saloon Car Championship. Four other drivers are also in with a chance here—Alan Peer (Ford Anglia), Mike Young (Ford Anglia), Chris Craft (Ford Anglia) and Colin Hextall (Tornado Talisman).

Longest race on today's programme is the 20-lap Silver City Trophy event for sports-racing cars. Chris Summers will be racing the ex-Brian Naylor Cooper Monaco in this event, fitted with his well-known Chevrolet engine. But Roy Pierpoint (2 litre

Lotus 15, Dizzy Addicott (Elva-Alfa Romeo), and a selection of Lotus 23s will ensure that Summers doesn't have it all his own way.

All finishers in the 10-lap Long John Trophy race for pre-war sports and racing cars, will be assured of something to keep out the Christmas cold, for they will each receive a Bottle of Scotch.



Throughout the season, motoring journalists are sometimes critical in their comments on the performances of racing drivers. A dozen of them will find the tables turned today, for it is their turn to show their prowess at the wheel of Ford Cortinas, provided by the Ford Motor Company, in the five-lap Grovewood Trophy race. Their skill with words is well known to most motoring enthusiasts but, make no mistake, there are, among them, some very quick drivers, and this should certainly prove one of the most closely fought contests of the day.

Undoubtedly, the most interesting motor car at this year's meeting is the specially-built Morris Mini-Minor, with one engine under the bonnet and another mounted in the boot! Called the Morris Mini-Minor Twin, it has been developed by Paul Emery, and will be driven by John Campbell-Jones. One would think that this car should have a startling performance, to say nothing of being rather startling to drive!

Though there has always been plenty of motor racing significance behind the annual Boxing Day Brands Hatch meeting, basically it is a day full of fun for both drivers and spectators. First conceived in 1954, this festive event has gone from strength to strength, and Nick Syrett, secretary of the British Racing and Sports Car Club, has described this year's entry as the best ever.

Far from being a day's enjoyment for club racers, Boxing Day Brands has attracted many top drivers and seen the racing debut of several exciting new cars. For example, at the 1957 meeting, Jack Brabham (later to be twice world champion) drove Bob Walker's 1.9 litre Cooper-Climax, the car with which, two months later, Stirling Moss scored his classic win in the Argentine Grand Prix.

In 1959, when Formula Junior was in its infancy, the Boxing Day meeting saw the first appearance of a number of new Juniors which, shortly afterwards, were exhibited at the B.R.S.C.C.'s first annual Racing Car Show. Most significant among these was the Formula Junior Lotus, this team's first-ever rear-engined racing car. This marque has subsequently dominated this class of racing during the past three seasons.

If you think, while watching the day's racing, that you can do as well as the drivers, then there are two fine opportunities for you to show your skill. Brands


