Today's Guards Trophy saloon car race is the first round of the 1968 British Saloon Car Championship (for the BRSCC Trophy).



FOREWORD BY BRIAN GROVES

There is far more to the Daily Mail "Race of Champions' which you will see here today, than just an exciting spectacle, with the top drivers in the world taking part.

For it represents to all the teams a vital chance to test their new and developed cars in competition before the European championship gets under way, and they set off on a whirl of races that can bring them fame — or disappointment.

That is why THIS race on THIS circuit is now so well established in the motoring calendar as a "must" for all the major Grand Prix teams.

The circuit is a perfect choice and one of the best in Europe for trying out a new car. It is tough, twisting and far more demanding than the flat, airfield type of track.

Most drivers would tell you that its 2.65 miles of "miniature Nurburgring" call for the utmost from both car and driver if fast laps are to be achieved.

Manufacturers have been working throughout the winter to perfect the machines that will carry their reputation round the world this year.

Lotus, of course, got off to a flying start in the 1968 Championship with a 1-2 victory in the South African Grand Prix, run on New Year's Day.

Former world champion Graham Hill is here today in one of their cars, and must have one of the best chances of winning. Few drivers know the circuit better than Graham, and I doubt if any engine is giving more power that the V8 Ford.

Then we come to the Ferrari and, let's face it, everyone loves to see the Italian red cars. Last year, New Zealander Chris Amon was given the job of lead-

ing the team, and by the end of the season proved that he was a brilliant choice.

Out in Australia, a few weeks ago, he was showing the world that the combination of Amon and Ferrari was a force to be reckoned with, by winning race after race in the Tasman series.

A win today would signpost the way for a promising season ahead for Ferrari, who have been striving for years to regain the championship which they once regarded as their own.

Out to stop them doing it, apart from Lotus, is a whole range of new Formula One cars being given their first try-out today.

World champion Denny Hulme has forsaken the Brabham that took him to victory last year, and is driving a new McLaren Ford, with team mate Bruce McLaren in a sister car.

Jack Brabham, three times world champion, has sold his 1967 cars and built two new ones for this year, both of which he hopes to try out in the Race of Champions.

Jack is now partnered by the young American driver, Jochen Rindt, who made his name in Formula Two racing, and it will be interesting to see how he handles the tremendous power from the Repco V8 engine.

Two BRMs are entered, sports car driver Brian Redman has his first Formula One race in a new BRM-engined Cooper, and there are several other cars which I haven't space to mention.

The result of today's race is important as a pointer to the gruelling season ahead, which starts in May with the newly-accepted Spanish Grand Prix, followed closely by Monaco.


And two months is little enough time to sort out any problems which the Race of Champions may bring to light!











Pedro Rodriguez cornering at speed in his Cooper Maserati during the 1967 British Grand Prix.

He is driving a works V12 B.R.M. today so watch out for the brilliant driving of the forceful Mexican ace.






Jackie Stewart tries out the 12 cylinder Matra-Ford for size.



4. David Hobbs

DAVID HOBBS first became well-known to Brands Hatch patrons in 1961, when he drove an automatic transmission Lotus Elite to several victories. Since then David has raced a variety of cars (from a Formula Junior Lola to a 6-litre Lola-Chevrolet sports car) at most of the Brands Hatch Internationals. This year the 28-year-old Midlander has his big chance. At the wheel of the Bernard White Racing V12 BRM he will be running in most of the major Formula 1 races all over the world, while in sports car racing (at which David really excels) he will be driving for the JW Mirage team in Ford GT40s and with the BRMpowered Mirage prototype.

On the British front David will be driving a Group 5 Ford Falcon for Malcolm Gartlan. But this is no ordinary Falcon - it is the special 5-litre Alan Mannprepared vehicle with which Australian Frank Gardner won last year's British saloon car championship title. Today David will be having his first outing in this car, while he is also in the Race of Champions in the Bernard White BRM. David was born in Leamington Spa and currently lives in a farmhouse near Rugby with his wife Margaret and his two boys Gregory and Guy. After leaving school at 17½ he worked at Daimler as an apprentice and his motor racing career began two years later, in 1959, with, of all things, an old Morris Oxford fitted with automatic transmission (David's father owned Hobbs Transmission). Following a few outings in his father's Jaguar XK 140 in 1960, David really began to set the tracks alight in his Lotus Elite in 1961, scoring 14 wins from 22 starts.

Single-seater, sports and saloon car drives followed during the ensuing years. He is best known for his drives in big Lola sports cars — he was John Surtees' partner in the Lola-Chevrolet and Lola-Aston Martin team last year.

Watch out for the name of David Hobbs in the top results of international Formula 1, sports car and saloon car racing this year. His name will be there.




