


Brands Hatch regulars who have not seen the midgets racing on other raceways since our last visit here on May 5th, will be pleased to know that John Davis suffered hardly any damage from his fantastic flip. As the supporters who follow the midget and hot rod boys around the raceways will know, John not only rebuilt the car within the space of about 10 days, he also won the Final at Wimbledon on Whit Saturday. For sheer guts and determination, John takes all prizes. Without a doubt the Eltham driver owes his life to his roll-bar, full safety harness and helmet. Since this event I have read of at least two circuit racing drivers being thrown from their cars and killed. Spedeworth insist on full harness being worn in open cockpit cars as well as in saloons. Apart from the John Davis incident, two midgets have been involved in terrifying collisions with the safety fence. Both drivers have walked away unharmed and are still racing today.

Also at the last meeting here, Derek Howe was involved in a show-stopping flip in his Stock Car. Derek also suffered no harm and was back on the raceway at Aldershot having repaired his car, just four days later. Most people, myself included, left the meeting sure in their minds at least that Derek would have to build a new stocky. . He proved us wrong, but, did confess to some handling problems after the Aldershot meeting.


The RAC have now increased slightly the numbers of cars they will allow to take part in Hot Rod and Midget events on the Clearways Oval. This will now be 15 Hot Rods and 12 Midgets. The increase though small should make quite a difference to the racing we will see today.

Almost on the eve of the European and British Championship events, news comes to us of a change in Spedeworth Stock Car promotions. This will come within the next few weeks and will mean that the Formula II's that you will see today will be re-named Superstox. There will also be a new formula known as Stock Cars. These will be just that. Cars absolutely standard with no modifications to engines or bodies allowed at all. There will also be a price limit in order to keep costs down. Basically cars will be saloon types up to 1622cc. This will be real Stock Car racing. With no great sums of money involved. Drivers will enjoy the freedom of worrying over costs of upkeep, and it is calculated that incidents will be far more frequent. This may at first glance seem to be a step backwards, but since there is no comparison between the old E93 A's and the newer models of 1622cc. that will now come into use, we could in fact be finding a really popular formula. One thing that is certain is that the overturned stocky, now a rarity, will again become a common sight. Drivers in the future with this formula at least, will not sit on the tail of the leading car for lap after lap without trying to spin it off.

Missing from the raceway today are three regular drivers here at Brands. Doug and Alan Wardropper along with John Gray are racing in Amsterdam this afternoon at the opening meeting for Stock Cars at the Olympic Stadium. This is where the European Championship title will be decided in three weeks time. Tony May, the present holder, will have the support of some







Let's hope that we will see more of these flips, we also had a triple flip from Derek Howe, finally spinning crazily on his front bumper in front of the control box. We of the Stock Car world have come to expect these sort of situations, yet in spite of seeing them at reasonably regular intervals, we still get a big kick at each and every one, and lick our lips ready for the next one to oblige !

In my opinion the Hot Rods stole the show at the last meeting, their driving was terrific the way they hung their tails out at each and every bend was to me a pure joy, if ever one wanted to display the time honoured saying "The beauty in movement" I suggest that they watch the Hot Rod boys in action, and marvel at them and their undoubted skill as they take the bends three abreast on full bore. When you get the mastroes of the raceways, Martin Morris, Terry Hayward, Barry Kimble, George Polley, Tony Maidment, Ginger Payne, etc. dicing it out with each other, each one sweating and at times cursing their way through a tight field, you are seeing a masterpiece in action, the constituents being Castrol R, highly tuned power packs, screaming tyres, and the correct gear ratios.

The Midgets try to fill the raceway with thrills and spills and at most meetings they succeed, as yet their numbers are on the small side, but as time marches on so the numbers will swell. The Midget drivers are now fully conversant of what is expected of them, and today they will be all out to show us that they mean to send us away with them indellably imprinted on our minds.

My pride and joy the stockie drivers will I am sure arrest your attention, they have been around for quite some time now, and have regularly raced against each other, but so great is the competition for points that no one has ever forecasted correctly the first three in any Grand Final over the last eight years, and in looking at it from any angle, it really is something to ponder over, why has no one ever been correct ? my only answer is to try and do so today. As they line up for the Grand Final bear in mind the results obtained in the heats, and then put pen to paper, you will be doing very good indeed if you get the first two right, if you get all three correct yell at the top of your voice, and I will join you in your jubilation. The stockies are fantastic machines, driven by drivers who can't always wait for the other chap to move over. If a slower driver doesn't 'move over,' he invariably finds himself courting the safety fence. Like the Hot Rod boys the stockie drivers also swear and curse, but they at least can and do push their way through. Watch their intent faces as they try and get by, listen to the exhaustive music as the driver slams his murderous right foot on the gas peddle, admire the armouring front and rear. Remember that the only way to success is the quick elimination of the opposition, that is the way our drivers have to race, cheer clap and whistle each and every one on his lap of honour; and be good company by always wearing a smile.







