

Flag Signals

MEETING No. 2

SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The Green Flag is dropped at the starting line when the race is on. During the race it signifies that the course is clear. The Yellow Flag warns drivers to use caution but not to change positions. It is used when "wide open" driving is not permitted. The Union Jack denotes the race has passed the halfway stage. The Red Flag is used to denote that the race has been stopped, and the Black Flag to order a car back to the pits. The Chequered Flag indicates the end of a race. Lights: GREEN – GO; AMBER – CAUTION; RED – STOP.

BEHIND THE SCENES . . . by Len Porter

Since our first meeting on the new Paddock Hill circuit four weeks ago, much midnight oil has been burned by enthusiastic drivers in an attempt to find the right combination of gearbox, axle and tyres for such an exacting course. Within the next few hours we should be able to see just how successful and worthwhile their efforts have been.

At every meeting since Easter, the Pits talking point has been Brands Hatch, and there is no doubt that this new concept in Stock Car Racing has fired the vast majority of the drivers with fresh enthusiasm — although one or two have been frightened off for good by the downhill straight. One or two drivers have already announced themselves satisfied with the changes they made, and it goes without saying that last months race winners won't be worrying too much about making changes — as long as they're winning.

The best single lap of our first meeting was recorded by George Ansell (375) during the Speed Jackpot event, when he completed one flying lap in 40.7 seconds, an average speed of 57.1 m.p.h. That was just 0.4 seconds faster than the best lap of Ian Ireland (267), who nevertheless produced the best times for the ten and fifteen lap distances. If conditions are right, then all the records could easily be broken again today, and we could even see a few more unexpected names amongst the top honours.

Ted Janes (66), Reg Pryor (109) and Roy Wilson (111) are three of the highly fancied runners who missed our last meeting, and any one of them is quite capable of picking up the trophy today.

In our Track Championship battle, Ian Ireland has a slender lead over George Ansell and Ray Pearce (234), but the season is still young, and when the grading system catches up with the early season anomalies, it's my guess that Ansell will reign supreme.

Last Sunday, George celebrated his 39th birthday and this is his eleventh season in Stock Car Racing. He was born in Norfolk — you can still detect the accent — and he now lives in Hertfordshire. He first raced at Brafield, and his rise to fame has been steady but positive with two years apprenticeship in each of the lower grades on the way up. For the last three seasons his forceful style of driving has earned him regular ovations at home and on his 1968 South African tour, his performances received the highest praise ever accorded to a visiting driver.


Last year he finished third in the National Points Championship seventh in the World Final, won the Brafield Hot Dog Trophy, and was Track Champion at Harringay and Hednesford Hills. George has a well-fitted coach-transporter and his wife and son travel everywhere with him. His 1969 ambition is to regain the World Title, and on his early season showing he has a great chance.

Roger Taylor (198) — younger of two racing brothers — is talking of building a new car especially for the Paddock Hill circuit. During the winter he purchased and rebuilt the 1968 Reg Pryor car, originally built by Les Suckling. This car now weighs just on 26cwt. ready to race, but Roger is thinking in terms of a lighter car, and it will be interesting to see if he is the first to produce a "Brands" special.

Good Afternoon,

Welcome back to Stock Cars at Brands Hatch for another meeting on the Mountain Circuit. We have today a full programme, which includes over 50 Stock Cars and 22 Hot Rods.

At our last meeting due to the Easter Holidays many of the drivers received damage on the Good Friday and Easter Saturday so therefore we suffered the loss by only 41 cars fit to race on the Sunday.

We have had many letters of praise, such things as racing fantastic, the best racing I have seen for years. One particular spectator was visiting England from Ireland and he himself takes part in Stock Car Racing in the Emerald Isle and was completely thrilled by the Big Boys as he called them. One or two of the letters we received were critical of using the Paddock Hill circuit, but we feel if the full 28 cars are available to take part in each race that our choice of Paddock Hill will prove to be the right one. While we have had some criticism to the Druids Mountain circuit, as opposed to the Clearways Oval we do believe that after several meetings the racing will improve, however we shall be trying the Clearways Oval again later in the year.

The men who emerged triumphant from our Easter Meeting were without doubt 267 Ian Ireland White Top, Ex-World Champ 375 George Ansell Red Top, 267 completed the fastest times in practise and 375 completed the fastest lap of the meeting, it will be interesting to watch how these two fair when 267 moves up the grades as he must do very shortly.

Today you will note that although the finishing line is as before we are using a new start line along the bottom straight at South Bank. This has been measured carefully and means that the lap distance has not been altered, we hope this change will improve our presentation and avoid the first lap pile up at the hair pin

By public demand we include today two races for the Hot Rods, upon their performance and reception by the public will depend whether we see more or less of them at future meetings.





So! Ian Ireland (267) is the first man to go down on the list of Final winners for the 1969 season here at Brands. It was, in actual fact, third time lucky for Ian in more ways than one, for our meeting here was only the third that he had raced at this year. The Oldsmobile engined car that he drives is now in its third pair of hands and Ian is competing under his third racing number, having raced on and off for several years, so don't be fooled by that White roof. He is destined for Star status in the near future, for after his success here, he went to Ringwood and Crayford where he gained places in both heats and finals.

Already into Star status is 375 George Ansell, the other man who showed a quick liking for this unusual circuit, winning three races and being placed second in the final. George and his controversial Pontiac powered special are really going places this year and at the moment it looks as though nothing can stop him. Although early in the season, it looks as though Ex World Champion George could be on his way to winning the crown once more for after competing at the first three World Champion Qualifying rounds, he won all three finals which already should see him near the front of the grid for the semi final at Harringay.
