## Saloon Spectacular and F3 Needle Match

With $£ 700$ prize money at stake, today’s Gold Cross Saloon car race has attracted the cream of club racing's saloon car drivers. All season long they have been battling it out in the Redex Gold Cross Championship here at Brands Hatch and at Mallory Park, Oulton Park and Snetterton. The title has now been decided, but today's event is a special bonus, open only to drivers who have competed in four or more of the Championship's qualifying rounds.

The Redex race is divided into two 8-lap heats, one for the up-to$1,000 \mathrm{cc}$ cars and one for the $1,300 \mathrm{cc}$ and unlimited classes, qualifying for a 10-lap final. The big interest in the over-1,300 cc class is the appearance of the new champion, George Whitehead, in the same team as his arch-rival throughout the season, Gerry Marshall. George, racing for the first time since his nasty accident in a Formula. Ford race at Oulton Park six weeks ago, has now sold his well-known mauve Anglia and is entered in the second Shaw \& Kilburn Vauxhall Viva GT. One often wonders how close rivals would show up given identical cars, and although George will be driving Marshall's older car (giving away 200 cc ), this could be an opportunity to find out! Both of these rapid Vivas could however be beaten by David Brodie's immaculate black Ford Escort which has a twin-cam engine brought up to no less than 2.1 litres. But Martin Birrane's formidable Ford Falcon, Reg Gubbings' Buick-engined Anglia and the quick Escorts of Brian Robinson, John Bloomfield and Zekia Redjep could cause trouble for all three of them

Both the smaller classes of the Redex Championship were convincingly won by Mini drivers. Mike Darrieulat took the up-to-1,000 cc category with his ' $S$ ' and competes today in John Stanton's interesting MG Gnat

- believed to be the only MG Mini in captivity. Local boy Rob Mason leads the all-Mini $1,300 \mathrm{cc}$ class but can as usual expect plenty of opposition from Ian McDougall and the Downton car of Richard Longman.

Less financially rewarding but tremendously exciting nonetheless are the prospects for the Lombank Formula 3 race. Today sees the final round of the Lombank Formula 3 Championship and it's a real cliff-hanger for in the current points standings Alan Rollinson leads Emerson Fittipaldi by only one point; and this after 19 qualifying rounds! Fittipaldi, the young Brazilian who has made such a dramatic rise to fame this season, only joined the Championship in July and has since won four rounds. Alan Rollinson, on the other hand, graduated to Formula 2 and Formula 5000 in mid-season and hasn't taken part in a Lombank race since May. In the early rounds he did however notch up five wins (and in his last F3 appearance at the British Grand Prix meeting scored a splendid win against full international competition). Alan has been lent a brand-new Brabham BT28 by Jeff Uren with which to do battle with Fittipaldi's Jim Russellentered Lotus 59 and the similar cars of Mo Nunn, Bev Bond, Roy Pike and David Walker. Also driving BT28s and potential winners are Tony Trimmer, who won the Lombank Trophy race here on October 26 and Alan Harvey who set a new Formula 3 lap record of 49.6 seconds on the same day. Another man to watch is the promising James Hunt, who, like Trimmer, Walker and Fittipaldi, has graduated from Formula Ford this season and goes very quickly in the Motor Racing Enterprises Brabham BT21B. Formula 3 has provided some magnificent racing this year and in the expectation that today's race will be no exception, the organisers have increased the race distance from 10 to 15 laps.

But the story of today's racing doesn't end there, for the Sevenoaks and District Motor Club have also gathered fine entries for three more ten-lap events. There is a full and varied entry for the Formula Ford race which includes another one of those fast Brazilians, Luiz Bueno with a SMARTentered Merlyn, Ray Allen, Ed Patrick and Henry Clark with Royales, Merlyn and Macon respectively, all entered by Motor Racing Stables, and Sid Fox with the D. J. Bond Pringett Mistrale. The Production Sports Car race is a round of the Amasco Championship in which Alan Woode's MG Midget currently holds a lead. In the big car class of this contest things are getting close too, with Mike Franey currently only one point behind fellow E-type driver John Quick. Franey won the last round at Brands Hatch on September 28 but on that occasion the real star was the remarkable little $1,275 \mathrm{cc}$ Austin Healey Sprite of Barry Wood which split the big Jaguars to finish third overall. The STP GT Championship also continues today and here the outright winner should come from the Chevrons of Willie Green and Terry Croker or the rapid Lenham and Saturn GTs of Ray Calcutt and Jim Morley. But currently walking away with the STP Championship with a series of class wins in the up-to-1,500 cc category is Martin Warren's diminutive Lotus 23.

So seven varied races, three championships including a final deciding round, plus a very special finale to the saloon car championship that has been one of the most closely contested series this season, promises some exciting racing today. The weather may be getting colder but the racing is as hot as ever.

## STP Grand Touring Car Championship

The British branch of S.T.P., the American motor lubricant company which has been so successful in entering Indianapolis 500 Mile Race winners, is sponsoring the S.T.P. Grand Touring Car Championship of 1969. This is being contested over 20 club-type meetings and National meetings from May to December at Brands Hatch, Mallory Park, Oulton Park and Snetterton.
