## Will F3 beat the 90 mph barrier today?

## Lombank, BOC and Hepolite-Glacier Championship rounds promise a busy afternoon

Will a Formula 3 car lap Brands Hatch at over 90 miles an hour this afternoon, and so set a new lap record?

This is a major talking point, and it is certainly on the cards, for today's Lombank Championship Race brings Formula 3 to the circuit for the first time since the recent change in the regulations for this tightly-contested single-seater category.

When Formula 3 was changed at the start of the year, the previous $1,000 \mathrm{cc}$ engines were replaced by units of 1.6 litres, but the international body ruling motor sport laid down that the induction systems should be fitted with a restrictor with a diameter of 20 mm . Experience showed, however, that this was carrying restriction a little too far, and the engines were noticeably down on power compared with the previous F3, so that lap speeds fell.

The lap record for the 1.6 litre Formula 3, with the 20 mm restrictor, stands at 50.2 seconds, 88.92 mph, and is held jointly by Colin Vandervell and Alan Jones, whereas the record for the 1 -litre Formula 3 was left at 49.6 seconds, which is exactly 90 mph .

A race held since the restrictor regulation was changed, increasing the diameter to 21.5 mm , has shown the 'new' Formula 3 to be just about as quick as the old 1 -litre F3. So it is surely reasonable to expect that not only will 50 seconds be beaten, but probably that 90 mph lap record as well.
Strictly speaking, of course, the fastest F3 lap this afternoon must count as a new record, because of the changed regulation, but all the experts will want the answer to the question: Is the revised 1.6 litre F3 quicker than the F3 of last year?

Colin Vandervell and Alan Jones are down to drive their Brabhams in today's 20-lap race, and so is young Roger Williamson, from Leicester, one of the season's most exciting finds who just pipped both of them in a thrilling Lombank Championship round here on June 20.

As Autosport said in reporting that June 20 meeting, '....it was the F3s which provided the real excitement.' It was a tense battle, with Williamson's March in the lead and Jones and Vandervell snapping at his heels. Jones slipped through into the lead at half-distance but Williamson got ahead again on the next lap. Jones got past a second time, but on the last lap Williamson made a brilliant overtaking manoeuvre to cross the line 0.2 second from Jones, with Vandervell 0.4 second behind Jones.

This performance by Australian Alan Jones brought him the BP Man of the Meeting award, and if this trio can have a repeat of that stern struggle then you are in for something really special.

Which is not to say that there are not several other drivers in with a chance, and threatening to topple this formidable threesome.

The Lombank Championship score at the moment gives Roger Williamson a 9 -point advantage over Colin Vandervell, but today is the half-way stage of the Championship and with quite a few qualifying rounds to come the issue is very definitely undecided, so both of them will be striving every sinew to capture precious points in pursuit of the $£ 250$ which will go to the Championship winner.

More, tight and thrilling racing is promised in today's round of the BOC Formula Ford Championship, to be raced over 15 laps after 20 starters have been sorted out in two 8-lap heats.

That very promising local driver Tony Brise, who is making a name for himself at a very early stage in his career, and who is very much at home on this circuit, will no doubt be pulling out all the stops to finish ahead of those tough rivals, Bernard Vermilio and Russell Wood, who are currently ahead of him in the BOC Championship points list.

Vermilio now has a handy lead in the Championship with his Merlyn Mk20, but there is still time for him to be caught, so that he cannot afford to let up. And remember that Tony Brise currently shares the Formula Ford lap record (with three other drivers) which he achieved recently in a time of 52.6 seconds, 84.87 miles an hour. It would not be surprising, given good conditions, to see that record broken this afternoon.

Today's meeting, organised by the Sutton \& Cheam Motor Club, also includes a further round of the Hepolite-Glacier Saloon Car Championship, sponsored for the second season by A. E. Auto Parts Limited, of Bradford.

As you will see, there are separate races for the up-to-1,000 cc saloons and the bigger capacity machines.
After winning the 'tiddler' class in the last round, also staged here, on July 25, Kent driver Ray Calcutt will no doubt be working hard in his Hillman Imp to stave off the challenge from Les Nash's Ford Anglia. Since Les has already scored nine victories in earlier rounds, plus a second place, he could truthfully be said to be formidable opposition! All the makings of a tremendous duel, and remember that in that July 25 race Ray Calcutt set a new lap record as well, in 57.6 seconds, 77.50 mph .

There is also the prospect of a close tussle in the $1,001-1,300 \mathrm{cc}$ class be ween Geoff Wood and Bob Fox, each in a Mini-Cooper 'S', since they are at the top of their class table with Wood Leading by a bare 4 points.

With a Formule Libre race as well, this promises to be a very busy afternoon.
