Blue (Waved): Another competitor is trying to overtake you.

Blue (Motionless): Another competitor is following you very closely.

White: An ambulance or service car is on the circuit.

Black (with Competitor's Number): Signal for the competitor to pull off the circuit next time round and report to the Clerk of the Course.

Black and White Chequered: Signal for the winner and end of the race.

MOTOR RACING AT ITS BEST

#### OSRAM-G.E.C. BARC SALOON CAR CHAMPIONSHIP

Eight years ago the B.A.R.C. started a Saloon Car Championship with the help of Cibié who sponsored this for three years after which Spring Grove Laundries took over for a further four years. Last year the B.A.R.C. undertook the complete sponsorship and this Championship proved immensely successful.

This year OSRAM-G.E.C., an internationally known company marketing lamps and lighting equipment, including a complete range of vehicle bulbs and sealed beam units, are sponsoring the Championship. Their participation now means that there will be almost twice the amount of prize money than last year which in turn has made the competition much closer and very popular. Not only will the overall winner receive more, but cash will be paid to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class, and in addition, some of Osram's products will also be given.

To give the Championship broader interest Osram organised with the approval of the Society of Industrial Artists and Designers a closed competition for the design of the trophy. Four leading designers were invited to compete and on 4th September a panel of judges, under the Chairmanship of Earl Howe, President of the B.A.R.C., examined the designs and selected the winning design, which was submitted by Keith Tyssen, Des. R.C.A. The Trophy represents the skill of the driver, the reliability of the car and the elements which affect racing conditions.

The overall winner of the Championship will receive £75 and the Trophy. In each class the winner will receive £25 and a Trophy; second, £20 and third, £15. The overall winner does not claim the first class award. The classes are: Up to 850 c.c.; 851-1000 c.c.; 1001-1300 c.c.; Over 1300 c.c.

#### MOTORING NEWS G.T. CHAMPIONSHIP

In today's programme there are two races counting towards the *Motoring News* G.T. Championship and with only three races remaining in the championship after today's meeting a very strong field has entered both events. The over 1600 c.c. class will in addition be competing for the Holts Trophy in the main race of the afternoon.

The Championship has been contested at selected B.A.R.C. race meetings throughout the country and each driver's 10 best scores in the first 13 races qualify for the final at Thruxton on 13th October.

The Championship is run in three classes: Up to 1150 c.c., 1151-1600 c.c. and over 1600 c.c., and points are scored on a 4, 3, 2, 1 basis in each class, so the Championship winner could come from any class. If there are less than four starters in any class only half points will be awarded.

The Championship winner will receive a Trophy and a cheque for £125, while the other class winners will each receive cheques for £50.

#### FRED W. DIXON SPECIAL SPORTS CAR CHAMPIONSHIP - 1968

The Fred W. Dixon Championship for Special Sports Cars (formerly Marque Cars) has been one of the trophies closely contested at B.A.R.C. meetings for eleven years.

Points are awarded in each class on an inverse position basis: 4 for a win, 3 for a second, 2 for a third and 1 point for a fourth. If there are fewer than six entries in a class, the points will be halved.

The overall winner of the Championship will receive £50 and the Fred W. Dixon Challenge Trophy which will be kept for one year and a replica. Class winners, and the overall winner cannot also be a class winner, will receive £25 and a class winner's trophy.

#### THE 1968 NATIONAL FORMULA VEE CHAMPIONSHIP

Following its successful debut in this country last year Formula Vee strides into its second season with a National Championship based on 22 club races. Of these 22 events 16 are to be run by the B.A.R.C.

The championship is run throughout the country with race venues as far north as Croft in Yorkshire to Lydden Hill in Kent.

Points in the championship are scored on the 9-6-4-3-2-1 basis. A driver's best 12 performances will be counted at the end of the season.

This year the championship has been made even more interesting for the drivers (and the spectators) with prize money in each race:

First man receives £25; 2nd £15; 3rd £10; 4th £8; 5th £6 and 6th £4. The outright winner at the end of the year receives £100 and a trophy, £50 for second placeman and £25 for third.

Just to add even more incentive to the drivers there is an additional championship point for the fastest lap in each race. And the real financial incentive to stay in front comes in the form of "lap money". This system pays £1 to the leader on each lap of the race, so if the race winner leads for each of the ten laps he can add £10 in lap money to his £25 first prize.

This year's championship is designed to provide the amateur driver with above average rewards for his efforts.





## CHITTY CHITTY BANG BANG



The car built by Alan Mann Racing for the film "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang", a replica of the original car, will be on display in the Paddock. During the afternoon the car will do a demonstration run driven by Jenny Nadin.

#### PADDOCK JOTTINGS

The first race of the day will be for Special Sports cars and being polite one would put ladies first. Gabriel Konig, attractive wife of Mark Konig, who successfully races a car of his own design and manufacture, the Nomad, in International long-distance races, is probably currently the fastest woman racing driver. The recent performance of her M.G. Midget has surprised many males, nearly always on the front row of the grid and now becoming a regular outright winner of races. She has been faithful to Sprites and Midgets for the last three years but co-drove with her husband in a Lotus Elan in the 1000 kms. races at Nurburgring and Spa two years ago. Main opposition to Gabriel in this race will come from the Chief Superintendent of Police for Northampton, John Gott, whose racing successes now are beginning to catch up with his tremendous record in International rallies when he was captain of the B.M.C. works rally team. Two more Healeys are entered by Stewart Hands and John Chatham, who are probably the most friendly of rivals on the circuits often lending one another engine parts, etc. Their two Healeys are the fastest racing today and both have produced many outright wins and class lap records. Race 5 will see the bigger Special Sports cars and a battle of the E types. John Lewis has had a couple of wins at Silverstone and Brands Hatch recently and should add to his list today; however Keith St. John who used to have thousands of fans when he was the official "pirate" radio station, Radio London driver, could well surprise the regulars with his newly acquired car; but garage owner John Britten, who only started racing two years ago, will surprise many with the performance of his incredible M.G. Midget. He has won innumerable races, and is currently leading the Fred W. Dixon championship in which he was second last year, and in 1966 he was winner of the Peter Collins Memorial Trophy for the most promising newcomer to motor racing.

In the two saloon car races all the top contenders in this type of racing are entered. However, one of the best known international saloon car drivers, Roy Pierpoint, whose Ford Falcon is now one of the fastest saloon cars in the country, will be very hard to beat. Roy was National Saloon Car Champion in 1965 and has had considerable racing experience in long distance events on the continent with Ford G.T. 40 and Porsche. This year he has won outright the National Saloon car championship races at Croft in Yorkshire and Brands Hatch on Summer Bank Holiday Monday. He has his own construction engineering company in Weybridge, Surrey. Current leader of the Osram-G.E.C. championship is Roger Taylor who used to be employed at Ford Motor Company but has recently started his own wholesale accessory business for commercial vehicles. He was runner up and class winner in last year's B.A.R.C. Saloon Car Championship with a twin cam Ford Anglia and this year has repeated his good form now with a Ford Escort. He recently got engaged to an attractive girl who was voted "Miss Motor Show" two years ago. Brian Bolton's car, a Cortina with a Ford V8 engine, always goes very quicly and Taylor and he usually share the winning of races. Bolton recently took this car to Sweden where he won the saloon car race outright and surprised the Scandinavians with his driving skill of this big, hairy car. He currently lies second overall in this year's Saloon car Championship.

In the 1300 c.c. class Janspeed Engineering's 1275 Cooper S will be driven by one of their competitions staff, young Richard Longman, who in his first full season of racing, is proving to be very fast indeed; in the Championship so far this year he has had two class wins, and has collected a number of lap records and non-championship wins. However John Handley, the ex-works Cooper Mini driver, should give Longman a good run this time. Handley won outright the race at Zandvoort in Holland two weeks ago and has had considerable experience in long distance racing with Coopers and M.G.s.

The Holts Trophy race for G.T. cars has many well-known names. Chris Craft's Tech-Speed Chevron G.T.B.M.W. is a likely winner, especially after his fantastic performance at Brands Hatch two weeks ago in the Guards International event, with the same car he was lying second overall to last year's Holts Trophy winner Frank Gardner, in the Lola, until a few laps from the end when he retired with no oil pressure. This year Chris is going really well in a great variety of cars. He is works Ford Escort driver for Broadspeed and has his own Italian Tecno F3 car in which he finished third at both the Martini meeting at Silverstone and the British Grand Prix meeting at Brands Hatch in the F3 events. Driving the Chevron, he was second to Frank Gardner in the Lola at the International meeting at Croft in August. Derek Bennett will be driving a similar car and he is the man behind Chevrons and has built this company into a leading racing car manufacturing establishment in a very short time. As well as G.T. cars, they build successful F3 and F2 single seater racing cars. Tony Dean will be driving his Dino Ferrari and will obviously try to repeat his win at this circuit on August 3rd. Tony is a garage proprietor from the North and has had many exotic racing cars and has raced pretty well every type of car there is. Currently he has two Ferraris and a 906 Porsche, and two ex works Lotus Cortinas which he drives in International events. He had one season in F3 and has done most of his racing in England, but last winter he did the South African series of events. He finished 3rd with his Porsche at the Guards International meeting two weeks ago. Lord Angus Clydesdale has entered Tony Goodwin to drive his car which he normally drives himself. Tony served in the R.A.F. in Singapore as a medical officer and with a single seater won the Singapore Racing Championship. This season he has been entering a number of continental race meetings with a F3 Brabham.

The small G.T. race should prove exciting with the works Lotus Europa car of John Miles, who is equally at home in a G.T. car as he is in a F3 being currently one of the fastest drivers in this class having had International wins this year at Zandvoort, the British Grand Prix meeting F.3 event and Croft; driving the Europa he finished first in class at the Guards meeting at Brands Hatch two weeks ago. Also in Lotus Europas will be John Hine driving for jazzman Chris Barber and whose experience includes two successful seasons in F3 racing, but possible outright winner will be Barrie Smith who this year has really improved since getting a competitive car. He had two outright wins at Snetterton two weeks ago and a recent trip to the continent proved worthwhile for he won the Jyllandsringen race in Denmark outright.





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
