


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
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
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Members are particularly requested to remain seated during racing. Members and their guests are also admitted to the Paddock and to all public enclosures.

B.A.R.C. members' badges do not admit to the stands in the public enclosures.

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


THE SCOTT GAZE **MEMORIAL CHALLENGE** TROPHY




Starting positions in the scratch races have been determined by best times in practice.





Great interest centres on the B.R.M. (Mark II, Type 15) modified since its appearance at Goodwood in September 1953. Its chief opponent to-day will again be Mr. Vandervell's $4\frac{1}{2}$ -litre Ferrari Thin Wall Special which proved the victor last autumn. Driving for Mr. Owen are Ken Wharton and Ron Flockhart.

Rodney Nuckey brings a $2\frac{1}{2}$ -litre Cooper-Aston on to the line, and Eric Brandon drives a 2-litre Cooper-Alta to-day. Both are 1954 models. These two well-known drivers will be at the wheels of 500 c.c. Cooper cars in the Earl of March Trophy.

Cars are on the line ten minutes before the start of each race. Warning signals are given on the hooter at five minutes, two minutes and one minute before the drop of the flag.

A new $2\frac{1}{2}$ -litre H.W.M. makes its first appearance on the racing circuit to-day. Duncan Hamilton and Lance Macklin share the driving.

The 1954 H.W.M. is similar in external appearance to its 1953 predecessor. 19

Throughout 1953 he was in the forefront of motor racing news, and his exuberant personality makes him one of the most popular of drivers. The Baron has recently joined the Swiss Scuderia Helvetia.

Roy Salvadori has come steadily to the front rank of racing drivers during recent years and is recognized as Connaught's No. 1 man. Besides a string of British successes at Goodwood, Crystal Palace, Silverstone and Charterhall, he came second, co-driving with Ian Stewart, in the 1000 km. race at Nurburgring in 1953. He is equally at home on Frazer-Nash and Aston Martin mounts. To-day he drives both a sports and a racing Maserati.

One, the $4\frac{1}{2}$ -litre Ferrari Thin Wall Special, has already made history on this circuit in the hands of Mike Hawthorn. The other, the 2-litre "Vanwall Special", is a new product of the Vandervell stable.


Tony Rolt won the Coronation Trophy last Whit-Monday at the B.A.R.C. re-opening meeting of the Crystal Palace Circuit. In July he won the Crystal Trophy and came second in the London Trophy races on the same circuit. He came second at Charterhall, and was well placed at Goodwood and Silverstone, all with a Connaught. Rolt made headlines for Britain last June by winning the Le Mans 24-Hour Race (with Duncan Hamilton co-driving) in a Jaguar. He has a growing-up family; lives at Coventry, and is a member of the Harry Ferguson engineering research team.

Reg. Parnell ("It's not Goodwood without him") has a list of successes far too long to include. In 1953 he won the Empire Trophy, was first at Silverstone in July, and at Charterhall in the sports car race. He won the second 9-Hour Race at Goodwood in August with co-driver Eric Thompson, came second at Sebring 12-Hour Race with George Abecassis, second in the T.T. again with Eric Thompson, drove the B.R.M. to fourth place last Easter at Goodwood in the Chichester Cup. To-day he will be in action on an Italian Ferrari.

Alan Brown is well known at Goodwood, not only in the big public meetings but at the Club's private sports car events. Last Easter he won the Earl of March Trophy in a Cooper 500 c.c. with an average speed of 80.97 m.p.h. He has won the 500 c.c. event in the Luxemburg Grand Prix (in 1951), and the Yorke, the Seaman and the Light Car Trophies. Equally formidable in the Cooper-Bristol (in which, with M. L. Currie, he came second in the under 2-litre class last August at Goodwood) he will be seen in action again to-day in both categories, including a new 1954 single-seater Cooper-Bristol.


Ken Wharton held the lap record for the Goodwood Circuit put up on the B.R.M. last Easter until Mike Hawthorn wrested it from him at the September International event. His successes continue to accumulate steadily, and in the majority of the big home events in 1953 he took either first or second place, and at Albi raised great hopes for the B.R.M., coming second in Heat 2. He won the B.A.R.C. special Coronation award, based on points, for achievements in a British car in events on the International Calendar last year. 

Most enthusiasts will know that he is a partner with John Heath in the Walton-on-Thames concern of H.W. Motors Ltd. Between them they are doing a great deal for British motoring prestige. He drives a new six-cylinder $2\frac{1}{2}$ -litre H.W.M. in to-day's sports car handicap. Last September at Goodwood he won the Sports Car Race, and shared second place at Sebring with Reg. Parnell.

Peter and Graham Whitehead are both at Goodwood to-day-Peter with a F.1 Cooper-Alta, 1953 model; Graham with a 1937 C-type E.R.A. Both have done exceptionally well during 1953 at home and overseas. Graham brought his E.R.A. s/c. home to win at Goodwood in the September Handicap Race with a speed of 85.42 m.p.h., and came fourth in the Goodwood Trophy. Peter Whitehead, co-driving a Jaguar with Ian Stewart, won third place in the Nine Hour Race here last August. The same partnership had given them fourth place at Le Mans.

Twenty-one year old Tom Sopwith, who recently formed the Equipe Endeavour (his father was the famous yacht racing personality), has come into the news quite recently with the Sphinx sports car which he raced at the B.A.R.C. members' meeting on 27th March with considerable success. The car is powered by a specially modified version of the Armstrong Siddeley Sapphire engine, and its performance will be watched with considerable interest.
