## EXTRACTS FROM THE RACING REGULATIONS

R.A.C. Permit No. R133

Flag Signals.-The following flag signals will be used as necessary to signa the driver of a car: National-Start. Red-Complete and immediate stop. Yellow (waved)-Great danger, be prepared to stop. Yellow (motionless)-Take care, danger. Blue (waved)-Another competitor is trying to overtake you. Blue (motionless)-Another competitor is following you very closely. Yellow with Verical Red Stripes-Oil on track. White-An ambulance or service car is on the Circuit Black with White Number-Competitor with this number to stop at pit on next lap Black and White Chequered-Signal for end of race.

Outside Assistance.-Competitors are warned that outside assistance, save from officials or a car pit personnel, may render a car liable to disqualification.
