Brian Naylor, fresh from his successes in Sweden, makes a welcome return, with both Cooper and the J.B.W.—so on with the meeting—I am sure you are going to have fun !

Our next meeting is October 11th, a SATURDAY. Full trade support for this meeting will mean some really good stuff. Three events: a race for the fastest sports cars in the country—a grand Touring Race—and, of course, the Autosport "3 Hour," which will once again run into the night and every effort will be made to capture some of the magic atmosphere of a little "Le Mans," with a fair, stalls, and a fireworks display-a grand finale to a grand season of motor racing at Snetterton.


