Ladies and Gentlemen.

Every motor racing season opens with an air of expectation and 1959 is no exception. The start of any race is always a thrill and it is particularly exciting when it is the first race meeting of the season.

The first race today is for unlimited capacity sports cars and is packed with so many potent machines and brilliant drivers that it should make a tremendous start to Snetterton's 1959 programme. Today we welcome back to Snetterton our old friends the "Ecurie Ecosse," who since their last visit have covered themselves with glory by two "Le Man" victories, their performance in International racing is legendary and needs no introduction from me. In addition to this famous team we welcome today the first public appearance of the Cooper Monaco Sports Car, this two litre car, in practise before the meeting, lapped the circuit within a fraction of a second of the out-and-out lap record and there is little doubt that despite it's small capacity it will give the Lister Corvette's and Lister Jaguar's a close run for their money, the Lotus fifteen's should also be very close to the leaders, if in fact they are not leading themselves. This is anybody's race and I am not going to try and predict a winner, but on paper this should be one of the most thrilling opening races of any meeting held anywhere, at any time.

A quick glance through the rest of the entry will bring to your notice a host of Formula II cars, sports cars of every shape and size, and Grand Touring cars as well. This meeting has produced a record entry for the Spring Race Meeting and I think I can say with confidence that it shows, firstly the enormous growth and popularity of motor sport and secondly the popularity of Snetterton among competitors and spectators alike. The Snetterton Motor Racing Club are alive to the growing interest in motor sport and are struggling constantly to improve circuit facilities for both drivers and spectators but to do these things cost money and I would like to say before I finish this brief piece on the race meeting, how much the club appreciates the co-operation of all those people who have paid to park their cars here today. Without your support it would not be possible for us to progress in the manner which we hope to do, and have, I think I can safely say, done in the past.

Archie Scott-Brown will always be with us, that is the feeling of the Snetterton Motor Racing Club. It was in this spirit they denoted generously to erect the Memorial which is to be unveiled after the meeting.





The first rule of the club, does I think, say, just what we are here for, i.e. : " (a) To encourage social intercourse between members of the club and to provide facilities for the meeting of one another to discuss, promote and generally take part in the sport of Motor Racing, Touring, and in fact any form of competition connected with motoring"; and "(b) To run a Social Club for the benefit of all persons interested in the Snetterton Motor Racing Circuit." Now that is a pretty tall order, so let me be more explicit.

Obviously the main interest of our members is the running of motor race meetings at Snetterton, whether on a National scale-or a Club "dice" for the fun of the novice ; in this respect we run five major race meetings a year, and a Club Sprint. We are also invited to most club meetings run by other clubs at Snetterton, so if in fact we are not the organizers, there is ample opportunity for the beginner to get experience. There is, I suppose, something of interest going on at Snetterton almost every week-end of the year in which members very often take a prominent part. Now, in addition to our many sporting activities, the club social life is well worth your consideration. We have our own Registered Club House in the Paddock Area of the Circuit, a wide variety of beers, wines and spirits are always available at reasonable prices ; access to this Club House (and the Paddock Area) is permitted to members, their wives and families, on race days and, in fact, at all times (families must come on a "Family Membership").

Guest tickets to the Club House are also available at 2s. 6d. each, for each race meeting. Club members may also buy the "Pit Roof Passes" which are strictly limited. There is a hard roof on the Club House giving a fine view of the racing. During the winter months film shows, club nights, talks, etc. are also held in the Club House at the Circuit.

In addition to the above items, a monthly news letter is sent out to all members giving details of our activities, and items of news, posters, carstickers, etc., are also sent to all members.

This is a live, active club, and does, we feel, offer the Snetterton race-goer excellent value for his f_1 or 30s., whichever the case may be; our steadily increasing membership does, I think, verify this.




