1. In order to maintain a fair balance between competitors competing in classes with large or small entries two scales of points awards will be in force:-
(a) Where entry in Class exceeds 5
(b) Where entry in Class is 5 or under

2. There will also be an over-riding condition that, should a car in one of the larger capacity classes finish behind a car or cars in a smaller capacity class, the maximum number of points awarded shall not exceed those which wout position in the ovall car of any sma
3. Bonus Points. In addition to the above awards a bonus of 3 points will be given to the competitor making the fastest lap in each class irrespective of the number of entries in the class.
4. Championship will be awarded to the competitor obtaining the highest aggregate of points in the four events counting towards the Championship. In the event of a tie the Championship will be awarded to the Competitor having the largest number of 1 st places in his class. Should this fail to produce a decision the Championship will be awarded to the one having the largest number of 2nd places. Should this still fail to produce a decision the winners will be declared Joint Champions and share equally in any award.
5. Any dispute shall be referred to the Committee of the Snetterton Motor Racing Club whose decision shall be final.

Car No. 41 finished 3rd in Class D and would normally be entitled to 7 points, however he has been beaten by 4 cars in Class $C$ and due to the over-riding condition is awarded the points he would have scored if he had finished 5th in Class C.

This clause prevents any car from receiving more points than a car of a smaller capacity class which finishes in front of him.
