A representative entry indeed.

## CONTINENTAL FLAVOUR

The Guards $500-\mathrm{kms}$. qualifies towards the European Saloon Car Championship and is the only British round on the series. Naturally, leading Continental exponents have entered to gain valuable points in the championship, including many Germans, Dutchmen and Italians. There are also drivers entered from France, America, reland and Austria as well as Great Britain.
