## Full-House Entry for Guards European Championship 500-kms Saloon Car Race

Preview of today's racing by Mike Kettlewell Photographs by Dave Gray and Peter Cromer

A full-house entry—including a massive Continental onslaught—has been received for the Guards European Championship 500-kms. saloon car race at Snetterton today. Cars entered include Fiat-Abarth and Alfa Romeo from Italy, Steyr-Puch from Austria, Panhard from France, B.M.W. and Porsche from Germany, Saab from Sweden, V8 Fords from America and Mini, Mini-Cooper S, Ford Anglia, Ford Escort and Ford Cortina from Britain. A representative entry indeed.

#### CONTINENTAL FLAVOUR

The Guards 500-kms. qualifies towards the European Saloon Car Championship and is the only British round on the series. Naturally, leading Continental exponents have entered to gain valuable points in the championship, including many Germans, Dutchmen and Italians. There are also drivers entered from France, America, Ireland and Austria as well as Great Britain.

The event, which starts at 2.30 p.m. and is preceded by a Formula Ford race at 1 p.m. and a Red Arrows flying display, is expected to last approximately four hours. Pit-stops will play an important part in race strategy and will certainly add to the excitement for spectators.

#### V8 TRIO

Largest cars in the race are the three V8 Fords—the Mustang of John Ewer/Sid Fox and the Falcons of American Eric Hauser and Terry Sanger/Terry Drury.

In the 2500 c.c. class there is a straight fight between Italy and Germany, the former country being represented by the supercharged Alfa Romeo G.T.A. to be conducted by Italian Grand Prix driver Giancarlo Baghetti and his fellow countryman Giovanni Galli—popularly known as "Nanni". The class is completed by three works-entered B.M.W. 2002s for Hubert Hahne, Dieter Quester and a driver to be nominated and no fewer than six of the much-fancied Porsche 911s. Vic Elford in Bill Bradley's Porsche is race favourite: Vic has already won this year's Monte Carlo Rally and Daytona 24-hours, was second in the Sebring 12-hours and won the 2-litre class in the Guards Trophy race at Brands Hatch on March 17th.

Other Porsche drivers are Ben Pon, Terry Hunter, Hermann Dorner, Karl von Wendt (a German nobleman reputed to have his own private race track in his grounds!) and Helmut Kelleners.

#### **BRITISH HOPES**

British hopes are in the 1600 c.c. class and rest on the official Alan Mann Ford entry of a Lotus Cortina for last year's British Saloon Car Champion, Frank Gardner. Chris Alford (Saab V4), Dieter Mohr, Enrico Pinto and Rhoddy Harvey-Bailey in Alfa Romeo G.T.A's and Austrian Willy Kay (Lotus Cortina) complete the class. MINIS PREDOMINATE

No saloon car race would be complete without a Mini or two. Six are listed in the 1300 c.c. class, including an official works entry for John Rhodes and Steve Neal. Gerry Marshall, Peter Lague, Mac Ross and Desmond Gibb are among the other Mini entries. The Mike Franey/John Bloomfield Ford Escort and the works Alfa Romeo G.T. Junior of Spartaco Dini add more variety.

#### POPULAR CLASS

One of the most popular classes is the 1000 c.c. division in which three Fiat-Abarth 1000 Berlinas oppose three Ford Anglias and three Mini-Cooper S's. The 1966 British Saloon Car Champion, John Fitz-patrick, drives an Anglia in this class, while British Vita Racing have entered two Minis for John Handley and Alec Poole. Italian driver "Pam" and the two Dutchmen Toine Hezemans and Ab Goedemans drive the Fiat-Abarths.

#### **DIMINUTIVE QUARTET**

Four cars come to the line in the 850 c.c. class for the "babies". Wilfred Menden/Herman Veder drive a Fiat 500-based Steyr-Puch 650 TR2, "Bagrit" brings his evergreen Panhard 24CT over from France once more, while two Mini 850s are to be driven by Dick van Yperen/Hugo van Lennep and George Cayley/Roger Heavens.

#### **FORMULA FORDS**

Also on the programme is a 10-lap Formula Ford race in which the country's leading drivers have entered—including teams from the Motor Racing Stables and Jim Russel Racing Drivers' Schools.

#### FLYING DISPLAY

A special flying display will be given by the Royal Air Force Aerobatic Team of Folland Gnats, jet trainers known as the Red Arrows. Not to be missed, the Red Arrows will be performing for approximately 17 minutes from 1.40 p.m.


