

Flag Signals

SIGNALS IN USE AT THIS MEETING

The Green Flag is dropped at the starting line when the race is on. During the race it signifies that the course is clear. The Yellow Flag warns drivers to use caution but not to change positions. It is used when "wide open" driving is not permitted. The Union Jack denotes the race has passed the halfway stage. The Red Flag is used to denote that the race has been stopped, and the Black Flag to order a car back to the pits. The Chequered Flag indicates the end of a race.

Lights: GREEN — GO; AMBER — CAUTION; RED — STOP.

BEHIND THE SCENES . . . by Len Porter

Changes in the Formula One specification are few and far between in the Rule Book this year. The "recommended" use of high-back seats and head-rests from the 1970 edition becomes "compulsory" for 1971, and for the first time ever a minimum weight limit has been added to the rules which fixes the formula one tonnage between 22 and 26 cwt., and prevents not only the building of tanks, but also the construction of potentially lethal featherweights.

The first official weigh-in took place at Brands Hatch on Easter Sunday, when 53 cars were offered to the all-revealing weigh-bridge. Over one third of them were found to be outside the regulation limits, and more than one star driver has been taking a critical look at ways and means of cutting down the excess freight. So far, no official action has been taken against the offenders, and unless a portable weighing machine could be procured for use at all circuits, it is difficult to see how the rule could be rigidly enforced. We must wait and see.

The Snetterton World Championship Qualifying Round invariably attracts a strong contingent of first rate drivers from both North and South alike, and today is no exception. There are thirteen qualifying rounds this year at which drivers can earn the valuable points necessary to get them a place in the all-important semi-finals, and even at this early stage the experts are already predicting the eventual winner. But it's a long eventful trail between here and Coventry in September, with more than one pitfall on the way — and I prefer to save my prediction for a later date.

Northern favourite to win the title for the second time is Rochdale whizz-kid Stuart Smith. Stu scored three memorable maxims in the first six rounds this years, and is a certain pole position starter for the Long Eaton semi-final. The scramble for grid positions in the Harringay line-up is not so clear cut, but George Ansell has the edge at the moment, and will obviously be going all out to consolidate that position today.

There are a number of surprise new stars in the first grading revision for 1971, and probably the most improved driver of the year so far is that whiskered Warwickshire wonder Fred Skinner. Fred was fortunate enough to be in the market for a new car when George Ansell decided to build a new one, and sell the car which had won him so many races here over the last two years. Since that day, Fred has proved beyond any doubt, that his previous low gradings were entirely due to the lack of suitable machinery. Now, with a professionally built car, he drives like a professional, and on circuits throughout the country, he's been giving George some really impressive competition.

Meanwhile, the new Ansell car is almost identical to the cast-off and goes just as fast.

A new competition has been introduced this year which recognises the enthusiasm of the drivers who always turn out for the last race of the day—the Helter Skelter. Each Helter Skelter at all circuits throughout the country now becomes a round in a new Championship called the Grand National, and at the end of the season the top scoring Helter Skelter specialists — nationwide — will be invited to a specially convened meeting. From year to year, the venue for this mini-World Championship will move about the country, and we hope it won't be long before we see it here on the Jumbo Track.

The fabulous little Mini-Rods are on show in two special invitation events today, and you can't fail to be impressed with the enthusiasm which every one of these drivers shows for his own chosen form of motor racing. The cars are meticulously prepared and the introduction of a grading system modelled on the successful Stock Car lines is calculated to produce some well-handicapped events. This formula is now moving into its third season, and the simple car specification is designed to put fast, close racing well within the budget of the average man-in-the-street.

Two widely differing types of racing on a fast open raceway — it all adds up to a highly entertaining afternoon, and if you don't enjoy yourself, then perhaps you should see a doctor!

The British Stock Car Racing Board of Control has designated this meeting a World Championship Qualifying Round, and we've invited all the top-liners to come along and consolidate their chance for a crack at International fame.

More than half the qualifying rounds have already been run, and competition this year is tougher than ever before. Fraternisation between the rival northern and southern factions has increased immeasurably, and several drivers from both areas have begun to make long regular hauls in search of new worlds to conquer. Today, with no other Formula One meeting to reduce our complement, we've got the biggest field of Senior Stock Cars ever to come to Snetterton, and with valuable World Championship points at stake, the racing is certain to be the keenest you've ever seen.

In addition to the 400 bhp giants, and by way of contrast, we've included two races for a formula not seen before at Snetterton, but already very popular at all our other raceways. These cars — the MINI-RODS — have proved enormously successful on the Brands Hatch Clearways Oval, and we've decided to include them in all our 1971 meetings here.

Promotasport presentations here this year will consist of four meetings—you'll find the dates elsewhere in the programme— and one of the major National events, the Eastern Drivers' Championship, is scheduled to take place here in July.

Elsewhere in the programme you'll also find full details of all the other Promotasport venues, and if you want to try something which is really different this year — you can't beat a visit to our Kings Lynn circuit for a look at the new-style Formula Two meetings. 30-car heats on this 400 yard shale oval have been made possible by newly agreed schedules, and the resulting spectacle is absolutely fantastic — it has to be seen to be believed. If you don't believe me — go and have a look — I'll be looking for you.

KNOW THE DRIVERS ...

152 RON ROGERS. — Known perhaps as the "quiet man" of Stock Car Racing, Ron began his racing career at Wigan in 1954, but it wasn't until the early sixties that he made it to the top. From 1962 to 1968 he appeared in seven consecutive World Finals, and although he has annexed both second and third places on no less than two occasions, so far the premier title has eluded him.

At the peak of his form in 1966, he walked away with the National Points Championship, and has been Track Champion at four different venues. His sturdy low-slung specials always seem to move effortlessly around the circuit, so that it frequently comes as a surprise to find him amongst the places at the end. His impressive collection of trophies, without words or explanation, tell the complete history of British Stock Car Racing.

274 DENIS DRISCOLL. — This 27-year old London garage owner starts his twelfth racing season this year, and is all set to make a renewed attempt on the elusive World Championship Title. Den is still driving the Jaguar-powered special which took him into the big time during the racing tyre era of 1969. Now — without racing tyres — he is proving that on tarmac or shale he is still a force to be reckoned with, and he started his 1971 assault on the title with a well-taken third place in the Brands Hatch Qualifier.

His best performance in the big race so far was fifth in the 1968 event at Coventry on wet shale, and this year on the same track he has every intention or doing much better. In addition to his racing commitments, Denis can always find time for a jug of ale and a friendly game of darts - but don't play him for the beer, he's championship class!
