

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Flag signals

Blue/Steady: Another competitor is close. Waved: Another competitor is trying to pass.

White: Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

Yellow/Steady: Danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down.

Yellow/Waved: Great danger ahead, no overtaking, slow down, be prepared to stop.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Slippery surface ahead.

Green: Proceed, hazard indicated has been cleared.

Red: (at Startline and individual marshal's posts): Race has been stopped, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals.

Black/Orange Disc displayed with White number: Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver, call into pits immediately.

Black/White rectangular with White number: Warning to driver that his behaviour (i.e. corner cutting) is suspect and he may be black flagged.

Black displayed with White number: Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

Yellow/Black Quartered Flag: (Racing ahead meetings)
On passing the flag at the Start/Finish line, the race leader
must slow down Significantly (to around 50mph maximum)
until the obstruction on the track is clear.

Black/White Chequered: End of race

Races at all Brands Hatch Circuits are started using a system of red/green traffic lights.

Bank Holiday Fun by David Addison

Welcome to sunny Snetterton once again for the East Anglian Trophy Day, a meeting with a real variety of classes.

The Formula I Sidecars are bound to be exciting, particularly through Russell, but it is the two Caterham Championships that can be relied upon to provide the four-wheeled drama.

The Vauxhall-powered cars have had two races at Silverstone and a 30-minute race at Castle Combe so far and the action has been stunning. David Walton won at Silverstone but a mechanical drama robbed the former champion of a finish at Castle Combe last time out. As a result, the Champagne Racing-run car of the former champion has some catching up to do in the title race.

That is led by the consistent Simon Jackson, just one point clear of Combe winner Clive Richards and Shaun Balfe a further point adrift. Each is a potential winner today, Richards in particular, buoyed by his Combe success, but the list of front runners is a long one.

Mark Humphrey, the reigning K Series Champion was the hero of Castle Combe, fighting his way up from the seventh row of the grid to second place and a win for the Maidenhead builder can't be far away. Ex-Rover Turbo racer Rob Mears led for but a couple of corners in Wiltshire before heading for the barriers, but proved that he is now a real force to be reckoned with, whilst John Grant easily ran in the leading bunch last time out and should also do so again today. Keep an eye on Edward Homer, who has switched across from single-seaters to Caterhams this year and gave Walton a tough time at Silverstone, whilst Bart Hayden and Nigel Taylor should go well, too. And if things get a bit hectic, they can always seek out Neil Delargy after the race. Neil, you see, runs a laundry and dry-cleaning company! Predictions? Richards, Humphrey and Walton, but I'm not convinced about the order

Life isn't much easier in the K Series where huge grids remain a feature. Last time out, the fun was halted by a red flag which gave David Clarke a maiden run. Clarke first appeared at the end of '96 at Donington, and after only some Pro-kart races behind him, promptly qualified the front row. He is certainly a man to watch, although circuit unfamiliarity may go against him. Michael Caine leads the Championship by six points from Clarke and the former road saloon man will be a front-runner again today. So will Group N refugee Michael Woodcock, who has won here in the past in Escort Cosworths, and Richard Fores. Ex-Formula Renault man Nick Dudfield is looking increasingly confident in the car now and should be up there, but Howard Redhouse could be the dark horse today. The former VW Beetle exponent put his car on the front row at Castle Combe - not a circuit for the faint-

hearted! In what will be only his second Caterham race, fireworks are expected today.

Against, the sportscars and sidecars are two national single-seater categories. The BoilingPOINT ARP F3 series struggled at Oulton Park recently with a small grid, but looks to be back to full health today.

Former TOCA-Formula Ford racer John Loebell scored his maiden run win in the category at Oulton in round 2 despite the attentions of Daron Bland and former champion Dave Karaskas. Steve Allen ought to be worth watching in his Dallara F393 which, although not eligible for points, is being run as the organisers assess whether to allow more modern Dallaras in to the series in the future.

Allen could turn out to be Loebell's biggest threat, although the returning Jeff Gresswell in his VW-powered Dallara can't be discounted.

Our final race is for the BRSCC's sadly now unsponsored Formula 2000 Championship. Catering for 2 litre, Van Diemen, built slicks and wings single-seaters, the championship kicked off at the demanding Cadwell Park where former Champion Mike Doble snatched victory with a brave move round the outside of Dick Ole.

There two are the men to beat this afternoon, but Mikes Turner and Harfield should be in there fighting for a win with series regular Martin Sismey not that far behind.

So a great day's racing ahead, keeping the BRSCC (EA) Centre busy just a week after the Archie Scott-Brown Trophy meeting. Enjoy!


1997 British F1 Sidecar Championship

The curtain rises this weekend on what is certain to be a hotly contested and spectacular British championship.

For some years now Britain has been the source of World Sidecar champions and also produces the top competitors in the sport. Last year's world champion has moved on but this weekend sees four times World Champion Steve Webster back for a warm up outing prior to his bid for a fifth world title. Steve is now part of the massively professional Swiss Bosiger team, but he's up against it this weekend.

The reigning British Champion Barry Brindley starts his title defence and is in no mood to relinquish the race easily. Brother Derek Brindley now riding for the Hanni Team in the World Championship is out here in his traditional ReadyMix

colours and is also determined not to give up without a fight. Derek's ReadyMix team mate Roger Body rides one of very few BRM V4s in the world and is fresh from World Championship pre season testing at Paul Ricard in the South of France. Rob Fisher fights for the four stroke corner after some outstanding performances in '96.

Martin Whittington, Clive Stirrat, Dave Searle, Ian Guy, Roger Lovelock & Kiwis Barry and Jane Fleury are amongst the European Championship runners looking for an indicator of the improvements they're going to get from winter development.

Last year's Inter-Club Champion Paul Smart tries his luck and hopes to embarrass a few big names, along with some of the other best of British club runners like Ian Hannan, & Dave Gordon.

For those of you who have seen sidecars before you will know what dramatic racing these pure bred racing machines can produce. For those that haven't prepare to be amazed. These machines are more like 3 wheeled Formula Cars than the sit up and beg economy transport that our grandparents were more used to.

Engines are high technology 500cc pure racing two strokes in Vee or straight four cylinder layouts or road based 1100cc twin overhead cam 4 strokes. They produce amazing power outputs from so few ccs, getting on for 200bhp, which enables them to pull driver and passenger around the circuits at speeds of up to 170 mph. The chassis, built in both the UK and Switzerland, are fabricated in either alloy steel tube or from Carbon fibre honeycomb laminates plus glued and riveted aircraft quality aluminium. This along with the 10" wide super sticky slick tyres produces prodigious levels of grip which mean that the drivers and passengers have to be fit to make the best use of them.

Teamwork is what this sport is all about. The passenger is just as capable of controlling the machine (or outfit as they are commonly known) as the driver despite being nowhere near the brakes or throttle. You'll see dramatic movement and seemingly impossible acrobatics as the body weight is moved around to maximise the grip on the right tyres at the right time. What you won't see is the precise timing as the passenger moves from one side to the other. This all happens within fractions of a second and if it doesn't then everything very quickly goes wrong because the G forces from either braking or cornering mean that just brute strength isn't enough.

With grid positions drawn out of a hat on the day there is sure to be some breathtaking jockeying for position.
